JUDE THADDEUS AND ISCARIOT From the Hebrew "Yehudah" which meant "praised".	THOMAS From the Aramaic name "Ta'orna" which meant "twin". The reason for this nickname is unclear.
JAMES GREATER AND LESSER From the Hebrew name "Ya'akov". The name comes from the Old Testament patriarch Jacob.	SIMON THE ZEALOT From the Hebrew name "Shim'on" which meant "he has heard".

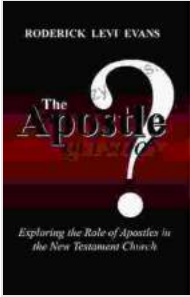
